

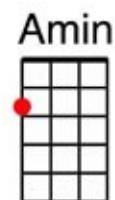
# Teddy Bear's Picnic 1932

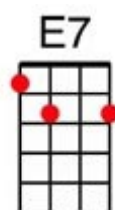


Intro:

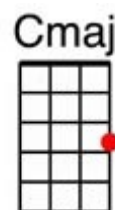
If [Am] you go [E7] down to the [Am] woods to [E7] day
